August 4-5, 2018 Grey Towers National Historic Site in Milford, PA "A celebration of our natural and cultural heritage of wood"

The family-friendly and free event will be held on Saturday, August 4 and Sunday, August 5 and offers a variety of activities and events that demonstrate the many ways we use and enjoy wood in our everyday lives. Entry to the grounds, parking and a shuttle are free. Self-guided tours of the Grey Towers mansion are \$5 per person.

What's new? This year the US Forest Service and its partners are welcoming stilt walkers, introducing 21st Century technology to the historic site, and expanding the free children's activities. Back by popular demand are free musical performances, including the Dixieland All Star Band and The Lost Ramblers acoustic folk music.

Craftsmen and artists from throughout the region will exhibit, sell and demonstrate
their crafts, all made from wood. Co-sponsored by the Pocono Arts Council, the crafts

- Children's activities include games and toys using wood and other craft activities. A
 cross-cut saw activity and visits from Smokey Bear and Woodsy Owl also are planned.
- Educational exhibits and informational handouts on such topics as beekeeping,
 Chestnut trees, regional conservation initiatives, will be ongoing throughout the weekend.
- Free music with wood instruments will be provided each day.
- Demonstrations on tree pruning and a portable sawmill are planned.
- A free wildlife show is planned for each day.
- Chain Saw Chix will demonstrate chain saw carving three times a day, each day.
- Refreshments will be available for sale.

Visitors of all ages are encouraged to download the free Agents of Discovery app to their personal devices before they arrive so they can play the Grey Towers Agents of Discovery missions and win free gifts. Visitors also are encouraged to download the QR code reader in advance so they can learn more about the trees at Grey Towers by scanning the QR codes on the Tree ID signs.

The event is offered by the US Forest Service, the Grey Towers Heritage Association, the Pocono Arts Council and numerous partners, participants and collaborators.

Pocono State Craft Festival 2018

August 25-26, 2018 Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm

The 32nd annual Pocono State Craft Festival will be held August 25-26, 2018 at the Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm, 347 Quiet Valley Road, Stroudsburg, PA. The event, cosponsored by the Pocono Arts Council and the Pocono Chapter of the Pennsylvania Guild of Craftsmen, celebrates the heritage, beauty and quality of Pennsylvania Crafts.

Since the first festival in 1986, the Pocono State Craft Festival has attracted the finest artists and craftspeople from across the United States and features traditional and contemporary handmade items. A destination for the discerning collector of quality art and fine crafts, patrons will find beautiful handcrafted items in pottery, jewelry, metal, stained glass, wood, baskets, leather, folk art, fine art, photography, soap, gourmet foods, and art-to-wear. Craftsmen will travel from all parts of Pennsylvania as well as New Jersey, New York, Connecticut, West Virginia and North Carolina. Live demonstrations will captivate patrons and bring the creative process to life — from raw material to finished product. All craftsmen will be available to discuss their individual work and provide patrons with an opportunity to purchase unique, high quality crafts worthy of the most ardent admirer.

Festivalgoers will also enjoy the beautiful surroundings and history of the Quiet Valley Living Historical Farm. The farm buildings, animals and beautiful gardens will be open to give visitors a taste of a 19th century Pennsylvania German farm. There will be live music from the Lost Ramblers on Saturday and a musical performance by the Music Theater Organization of East Stroudsburg University on Sunday, plus a variety of festival foods and baked goods from Quiet Valley. The entire family will enjoy a day in the country, strolling through the colorful tents and grounds at the farm.

Festival hours are 10am-5pm on both Saturday and Sunday, rain or shine. Admission is \$6.00 for adults; children 12 and under are admitted free. Parking is free. Quiet Valley is a working farm and there is absolutely NO PETS AND NO SMOKING PERMITTED ON THE PROPERTY. Since the festival is located on a historical working farm with grass and gravel driveways, it is not fully ADA compliant, however, many folks using wheel chairs and walkers enjoy the festival.

Volunteerism

At this year's Spring for the Arts annual fundraising event held May 4 at Stroudsmoor Country Inn, Executive Director Sue Randall introduced the "Laura Goss Volunteer of the Year Award." To honor Laura and her 25 years of dedicated service to the arts council, each year, going forward, an outstanding volunteer will be recognized for his or her valuable contribution to the Pocono Arts Council and its mission to support the arts in our community. The award will be bestowed annually to a volunteer whose dedicated service makes a significant impact over the course of a year. Criteria for evaluating the award is in development and the first recipient will be recognized at the Annual Meeting in December 2019. The winner's name will be engraved on a plaque that will be permanently installed in the ARTSPACE Gallery.

The Pocono Arts Council is comprised of a small staff and a board of directors that depends on and is appreciative of the volunteer efforts of its members. Many volunteer opportunities exist, such as gallery sitters on weekends, helping hands at special events and festivals, auction donation team members, newsletter and communication assistants, administrative assistants, and graphic artists.
