


# PoconoArt Celebrates 2017 As the Year of the Emerging Artist!

And it was accomplished in a little over a year by Pocono Arts Council member Jason Williamson. Adding to these successes, Jason is now one of five winners of the 2017 ArtPop billboard competition. That is why we have named him as our first "Emerging Artist of 2017".

Born into an artistic family 31 years ago, Jason moved here from N.J. when he was two years old. His love of art began at a very young age. His artistic skills became further refined through education and several mentors, including renowned local artist John James. He graduated from Pocono Mountain High School, attended Northampton Community College and studied Fine Art at Kutztown University.



Working predominantly in oils, Jason favors a loose impressionistic style and has also mastered the art of abstraction. Both his impressionistic and abstract paintings are equally compelling and both have been prize-winners for this talented young man.

On January 27, 28, and 29, the Quality Inn in Stroudsburg will open its doors for the 17th annual Winterfest featuring 16 bands, 2 stages, workshops, a Jam Band contest, vendors, and plenty of room for jamming!

The festival started in 2000 as an alternative to the summertime campout music festivals that are held all over the country. There is no outdoor camping at Winterfest, but there is plenty of relaxing and jamming by the pool/atrium/Tiki Bar. And there are stage shows on two stages from Friday through Sunday. The hotel will be filled with bluegrass lovers and many local and regional musicians who use the festival weekend as a chance to hang out and play together in impromptu sessions all over the hotel. There are other activities included in the weekend: a community concert on Friday evening, 6:30 PM, at the ARTSPACE Gallery featuring the Lost Ramblers; a kids program with Uncle Pete Taney on Saturday At 1PM at the PoconoArts Cultural Center; a variety of instrumental workshops; and a jam band contest on Saturday and there will be a variety of merchandise vendors throughout the weekend.
