## Nature and Geometry

Bill currently teaches Art and Visual Thinking and 2-D Design and Color at the Monroe campus of Northampton Community College.

"The exhibition entitled "Nature and Geometry" invokes concepts such as inspiration, purity and tradition, as well as complexity, uniformity and precision. For the continual bounty of both "nature" and "progress," we must find a synthesis between the finite realities of the natural world and humankind's desire for continual advancement. The works of Art that were awarded honors express, in a unique way, these varying attributes. **First Place is awarded to Tricia Lowrey Lippert.** Her piece entitled "Brothers of a Different Color" expresses the overwhelming beauty of mankind's first inspiration, perhaps the catalyst for art and creativity: Nature. **Second Place is awarded to Tracy Granger.** Her piece entitled "Sedona Sun" is an expression of the bounty and utility of the natural world using man-made yet nature-derived materials: Fiber. **Third Place is awarded to Cole Hastings Goldstein.** His piece entitled "Drape Chandelier" is a work of Art that tackles the realities of progress, i.e. technology and innovation, with the acknowledgement of the fragility of nature through the use recycled materials and energy efficient technology."

## Members' Spotlight

Stroudsburg artist **Heidi Hooper** was a featured guest on ABC TV's "To Tell the Truth" show on Sunday, June 17. Hooper is nationally known as the world's leading artist working in the unusual medium of dryer lint. She has been called "The Andy Warhol of Dryer Lint" by Consumer Reports magazine and her work has been featured on CBS Sunday Morning and in Ripley's Believe it or Not books and museums around the world. She is a two-time Niche Award winner. Her work is also featured in A Mano Galleries in New Hope, Pennsylvania. On "To Tell The Truth" a celebrity panel has to guess which of three people is the real dryer lint artist, but the other two are allowed to lie whereas Hooper cannot. Hooper's artwork was prominently displayed beside them. The celebrity panel included Mel Brooks, Joel McHale, Bill Hader and Natasha Leggero. Hooper studied sculpture at Virginia Commonwealth University and obtained her master's from the Massachusetts College of Art. She began working in dryer lint after a cancerous tumor ate away most of the muscle in her arm, leaving her handicapped and unable to pursue metalwork. **Education:** The Pocono Arts Council will provide art education opportunities and nurture growth in individuals and organizations offering instruction and participation in arts and cultural activities.

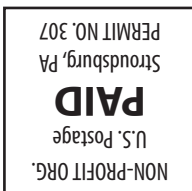
