"Earth Speaks V: A Juried Exhibition on the Environmental Crisis"

"The Earth Speaks V: A Juried Exhibition on the Environmental Crisis," is on exhibit in The Dunning Gallery at NCC Monroe from April 6-May 23, 2019. The Earth Speaks is an artist's means of capturing their concern regarding the climate crisis and how it affects our planet, as well as an opportunity to offer possible solutions.

Forty artists submitted 70 pieces to be juried. 50 works were selected to be included in the show from artists residing in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, Massachusetts, and Connecticut. Awards were granted in the following categories to those encapsulating the environmental crisis theme:

Juror's Choice Award: "Jelly Nation," Marsha Borden, Guilford, CT; **Kay & Girard Lichty Climate Crisis Award:** "A Voter's Advertisement," Brianna Cook, Tannersville, PA; **Otto Grever Printmaking Award:** "Desert Sea I," Scott Magin, New York City, NY; **3-D Award:** "PLAN{et} B Ain't Pretty," Susan O'Hanlon, Downingtown, PA; **2-D Award:** "Fracking-Marcellus Shale," Mary Waltham, Princeton, NJ; **Photography Award:** "Make America Gasp Again," Jack Swersie, Reeders, PA; **ARTSPACE Gallery Student Award:** "Plady" and "Blue Ocean," Maxine Leu, SUNY New Paltz, NY; **Origins Gallery Award:** "Dead Air," Matthew Casella, East Stroudsburg, PA; **Honorable Mention:** "Frog Queen," Ian Leiva, East Stroudsburg, PA

Juror for the show was **Harry C Tabak**: Tabak's early work reflects his bond to nature through his landscape paintings. Social commentary followed with an emphasis on environmental issues for nearly two decades. These works were the subject of numerous exhibitions at the Dorsky Galleries in NYC (80's) and museums. The Wichita Art Museum sponsored a traveling exhibition titled "The Radwaste and Stonehenge Books" a series of sculptural 'books' in a collaboration with artist Nava Atlas. The series then traveled to several other museums sponsored by the Art Gallery at SUNY New Paltz (now the Dorsky Museum). Tabak began to explore sculpture as a medium in 2001 utilizing found natural materials. These became the basis for his current experiments often describes as 'three dimensional drawings'. These are compositions utilizing wood, stone, glass, discarded broken materials, as well as metallic objects. Mr. Tabak studied Painting and Sculpture at The Art Students League of NY; Brooklyn College.

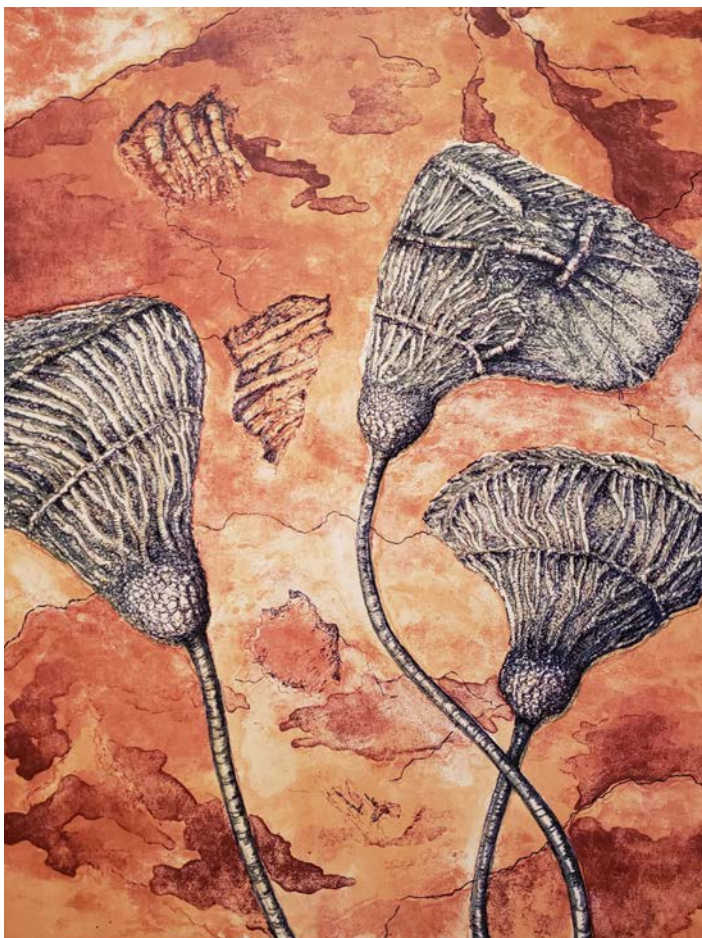

Acrylic Techniques for Lyrical Abstraction

Instructor: Doug Gilbert, professional artist and acrylic painter with 50 years of experience.

Lyrical Abstraction requires the development of both painting technique and psychological approach to creating an artwork. This program will teach some of the fundamentals required for a successful foray into the world of lyrical abstract painting which was originally championed by Wassily Kandinsky, Joan Miro, Arshile Gorky, and several other notable artists. It will focus on acrylic painting techniques and provide instruction for the following skills.

Acrylic Painting Skills:

- Drawing with Paint
- Staining/Wet on Wet
- Glazing and Scumbling
- Dry Brush

Psychological Skills:

- Automatic Image Creation
- Quieting Mental Distraction

Program Objective:

By the conclusion of the program, the student should understand how to use one or more of the suggested methods of starting a lyrical abstract painting and how to use a variety of acrylic painting techniques to finish the creation. The student will have completed several paintings done during the program to take home.

Pre-requisites

This program is not a beginner course in acrylic painting. Students should have a good understanding of the color wheel and be familiar with the mixing of color and the use of the paintbrush. Prior experimentation with abstraction is not required.

The Pennsylvania Partners in the Arts (PPA) program, a regrant initiative of the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts (PCA), a state agency, administered in northeastern PA by the Pocono Arts Council (PoconoArts), is now accepting applications for PROJECT STREAM grants for art projects in Lackawanna, Luzerne, Monroe, Pike and Wayne counties. Arts-related and community-based non-profit organizations or individual artists conducting arts programming open to the community are eligible for the grants and are encouraged to apply. Awards, not to exceed \$2,500, will be made through a local decision-making process. A total of \$46,867 in awards will be made in the 5-county area. Applications are taken online via Department of Community & Economic Development's Electronic Single Application www.esa.dced.state.pa.us. Submission Deadline is June 20th, 2019.
